Event

On arrival at the EICC, please ensure you attend registration which is located outside the Lennox Suite entrance, circled on the following page in orange. Registration will open at 10:00 where you will receive your name badge which will ensure your access to all sessions.

Please note, with over 2,000 people to register for the day there may be times where there are long wait times at registration. We would ask you to bear with us as we check people in as quickly as possible.

Cancellation

Per the terms and conditions you agreed to on the SDP website, if you are unable to attend an event for any reason then please cancel via the link sent to you in the Event Confirmation email, login to the SDP website to manage your booking, or email **info@sdpscotland.co.uk** at least 48 hours before the event. Please note that failing to attend an event without cancelling your place 48 hours in advance may result in SDP charging you an administration fee.

The EICC is located at 150 Morrison Street, Edinburgh, EH3 8EE | <u>View Location Map</u> There are two entrances into the EICC. Please use the Lennox Suite Entrance.



Edinburgh has two railway stations:

Waverley Station, which is 1.3 miles from EICC, is the city's main railway station and has direct routes to many cities across the country.

Haymarket Station, which is just 0.4 miles from EICC. Please ensure that you check with your rail network provider to find out if your train will stop at Haymarket or Waverley.

Edinburgh Trams run between the Airport and York Place every 8-10 minutes Monday to Saturday. The closest tram stop to the EICC is at Haymarket Station. Please visit Edinburgh <u>Trams website</u> for more details.


